Core Functions and Services, Products and/or Activities

The <u>Enforcement and Investigation</u> section contains the bulk of duties within the Department of Public Safety. This core function is made up of traffic enforcement, criminalistic lab services, and narcotics and criminal investigations, as well as providing assistance to other law enforcement entities in the state when requested.

The <u>Education</u> section of the Department of Public Safety ensures that the Fire Service Training Bureau conducts up to date training across the state that is certified to a level of Pro-Board and International Fire Services Accreditation Congress (IFSAC).

To support the Department of Public Safety, the <u>Community Coordination and Development</u> section develops and collaborates on projects involving substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and enforcement.


The <u>Regulation and Compliance</u> section supports the Department of Public Safety by providing effective administration and oversight of various program areas to ensure agreement with state and federal laws, as well as program policies.

To support the Department of Public Safety, the <u>Research</u>, <u>Analysis</u>, and <u>Information</u> <u>Management</u> section is responsible for the collection and dissemination of intelligence information, housing the Sex Offender Registry, and completion of criminal history background checks.

To support the Department of Public Safety, the <u>Resource Management</u> section ensures that sworn and non-sworn personnel receive their required yearly training.
