AGENCY OVERVIEW

The Iowa Department of Public Safety is an agency within the executive branch of Iowa State Government. It was established in 1939, when Iowa Code Chapter 80 was adopted.

The Department has seven divisions:

- Administrative Services,
- Criminal Investigation,
- State Fire Marshal,
- Intelligence & Fusion Center,
- Professional Development, Support Services
- Narcotics Enforcement, and
- Iowa State Patrol

and the Office of the Commissioner, which includes the Commissioner, the Executive Officer to the Commissioner, the Department's Policy Advisor, General Counsel, the Commissioner's Executive Secretary, and five bureaus:

- Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau,
- Interoperable Communications Bureau.

- Professional Standards Bureau, and
- Strategic Communications Bureau

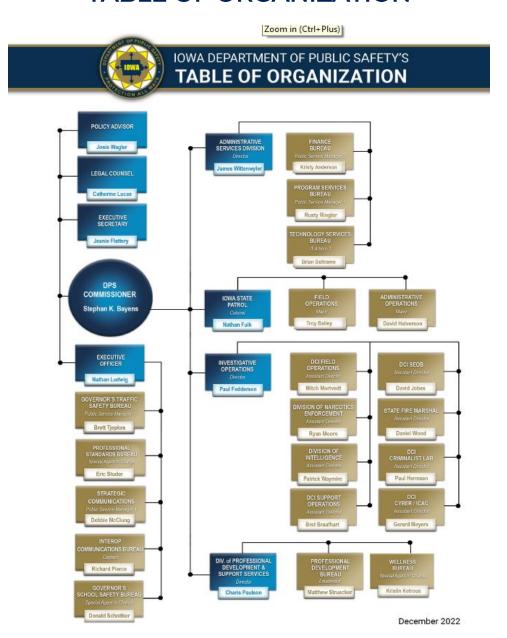
Regulation and Compliance – "regulatory" activities, such as fire prevention inspections, code enforcement, and licensing activities.

Research, Analysis and Information Management – criminal intelligence, criminal history records, uniform crime reporting, public information activities, management of the lowa Statewide Interoperable Communications System (ISICS), the Iowa Sex Offender Registry, and the Iowa Missing Persons Information Clearinghouse.

Education and Training – education and training is provided by all DPS divisions; examples include: education and awareness training provided by Iowa State Patrol and the Division of Narcotics Enforcement for citizens and other local law enforcement; Fire Service Training Bureau, and the Volunteer Fire Fighter Training and Equipment Fund, and the Office to Combat Human Trafficking

Resource Management – internal management of the Department's resources as well as some specialized services for external customers, such as administration of the Public Safety Peace Officers' Retirement, Accident and Disability System, and the Iowa Online Warrants and Articles (I.O.W.A.) System.

KEY STRATEGIC CHALLENGES & OPPORTUNITIES

The lowa Department of Public Safety draws on a well-established reputation of integrity and professionalism, which reflects the basic strengths of the Department, its divisions, and leadership. The Department's ability to provide a comprehensive and immediate response to critical incidents and natural disasters by providing sustained personnel and specialized expertise remains a significant strength.

- With the support of the Governor and Legislature, the Department of Public Safety has officers throughout the state actively supporting local communities through their professional and personal lives.
- The lowa State Patrol, working with the Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau, takes the lead in enforcing traffic laws, in an attempt to reduce fatality and serious injury accidents on the state's interstate and primary highways. In addition to our core function of traffic safety, the lowa State Patrol provides a variety of specialty units, including but not limited to, four regional Tactical/Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) response teams, Technical Accident Investigators (T.I.'s), Crisis Negotiators, Drug Recognition Experts (DRE's), Iowa State Patrol Public Resource Officers (PRO's) and pilots with Forward Looking Infrared Radiometer (F.L.I.R.) capabilities.
- Public Safety Communications provides police radio services to federal, state, and local law enforcement and regulatory agencies. Administration of the lowa Statewide Interoperable Communications System provides public safety agencies, first responders, schools, and utility workers with unprecedented connectivity, and now supports nearly 32,000 radios statewide.
- The Division of Criminal Investigation provides the expertise to investigate major crimes, including, but not limited to, suspicious deaths, financial crimes, and human trafficking, as well as tracking and ensuring that convicted sex offenders are in compliance with their statutory requirements. The DCI also has responsibility for ensuring the integrity of lowa's gaming industry.
- The Division of Criminal Investigation's Criminalistics Laboratory provides forensic analysis services to all lowa law enforcement and prosecutors.
- The State Fire Marshal works closely with both the career and volunteer fire services in the state and has a leadership role in providing training to firefighters; providing expertise and assistance in the investigation of fires of suspicious or unknown origin and incidents involving explosives; adopting and enforcing fire and building codes; licensing of electricians and electrical contractors; and adopting standards for electrical work and inspections of electrical installations.

- The Division of Narcotics Enforcement serves as the lead agency in the state providing public safety through
 investigative enforcement of laws relating to narcotics and other controlled substances, significant training and
 instruction to partners in local law enforcement, and intervention efforts for lowa's drug endangered children who
 are frequently neglected and abused.
- The Division of Intelligence and Fusion Center provides the framework for sharing criminal intelligence information among law enforcement, and a broader role in ensuring the distribution of intelligence related to homeland security concerns to agencies and partners in both the public and private sectors.
- The Administrative Services Division (ASD) administers the I.O.W.A. System, a statewide computer network serving all of law enforcement in the state which enables rapid access by law enforcement officers to information about warrants, wanted persons, protective orders, stolen vehicles, and a variety of other information useful to the officer in the field. Also, the Program Services Bureau within ASD provides expertise and standardized training to our partners in County Sheriff's Departments regarding issuance and revocation of weapons permits.

Major strategic challenges which faced the Department during FY 2022 include the following:

- Staffing of peace officer positions within the Department remains a high priority. The lowa State Patrol has significantly fewer Troopers on the roads even though the demands for those services have risen. The demand for investigative peace officers continues to increase on major cases and in support of local law enforcement. Recruiting qualified applicants continues to be a significant challenge for the Department. In order to sustain a highly respected and effective law enforcement organization, members of the Department are taking an active role in recruiting citizens of the highest caliber who possess the character and skills that align with the core values of the Department.
- The Division of Criminal Investigation's Crime Lab is quickly reaching capacity due to the implementation of new technology and significant changes in workflows and types of evidence examined. Additionally, recruiting and retention of forensic analysts is becoming increasingly difficult. The qualified applicant pool for these positions has decreased, and the entry level salary is becoming less attractive to top candidates.
- Iowa State Patrol district offices require resources for routine and major maintenance, which have been offset by funds for some major maintenance projects through the Vertical Infrastructure Program. DPS is continually looking for opportunities to reduce lease expenses and ensure energy-efficient facilities and strategies.
- Increasing demand for investigative services impacts the case workload handled by all divisions. For example, the Division of Narcotics Enforcement is facing the illicit and dangerous trafficking of fentanyl and other synthetic

- opioids. The pervasiveness of fentanyl and other opioids has caused a record number of overdose deaths in the state. DNE has encountered record amounts of increasingly pure methamphetamine, and elevated levels of drug-related violence.
- The Cyber Crime Bureau in the Division of Criminal Investigation has seen an upward trend in criminal activity involving the use of computers and digital technologies. This area will continue to demand increasing investigative resources for the foreseeable future. Intensive initial and ongoing training, as well as specialized equipment, are requirements for those engaged in this growing field.
- The Division of Intelligence and Fusion Center has seen an increase in media attention as it relates to human trafficking. A significant obstacle in combating human trafficking is promoting and persuading individuals to report incidents. Victims are scared and manipulated, and often do not cooperate with law enforcement. The Office to Combat Human Trafficking has created a website to educate the public and provide a place for tips to be made, but an lowa-specific tip line does not exist for the public to call. The lack of reporting mechanisms remain a challenge in combating this crime.
- Additionally, the State Fire Marshal Division is tasked with building, fire, and electrical inspections as well as plan reviews. Lastly, the Arson and Explosives Bureau must triage requests for fire investigations due to increasing demand.

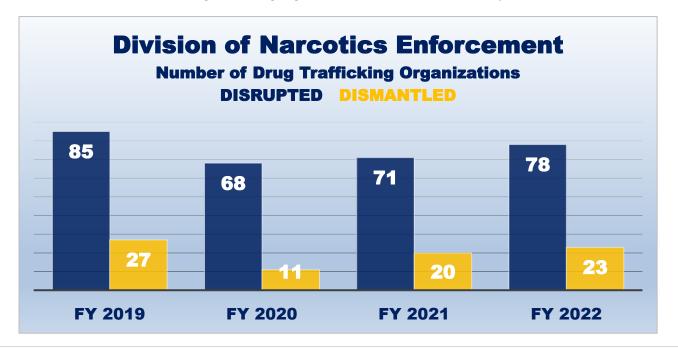

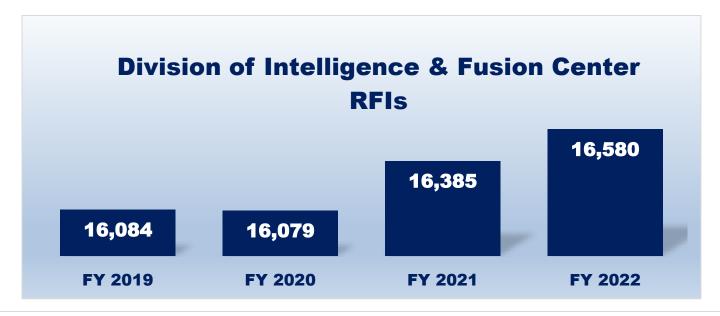
