A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act making appropriations to the economic development

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY ECONOMIC
- 2 DEVELOPMENT.
- 3 l. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, the goals
- 4 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and
- 5 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and
- 6 increase the population of the state.
- 7 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic
- 8 development authority shall do all of the following for the
- 9 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023:
- 10 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that
- 11 result in commercially viable products and services.
- 12 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free
- 13 market, private sector philosophies.
- 14 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the
- 15 state.
- d. Work with businesses and communities to continually
- 17 improve the economic development climate along with the
- 18 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.
- 19 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they
- 20 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.
- 21 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to
- 22 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential.
- 23 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,
- 24 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.
- 25 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through
- 26 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks
- 27 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small
- 28 businesses.
- 29 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of
- 30 life to foster economic growth.
- 31 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development
- 32 through development, expansion, and modernization of
- 33 infrastructure.
- 34 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses
- 35 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism

- 3 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative
- 4 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

- 32 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in

- 34 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
- 35 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this

- 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS
- 3 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in

- 5 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are
- 6 citizens of the United States who reside within the United
- 7 States, or any person authorized to work in the United States
- 8 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens
- 9 residing in the United States.
- 10 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in
- 11 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and
- 12 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the
- 13 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who
- 14 reside within the United States, or any person authorized to
- 15 work in the United States, pursuant to federal law, including
- 16 legal resident aliens residing in the United States.
- 17 c. A business that receives financial assistance from
- 18 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall
- 19 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this
- 20 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided
- 21 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received
- 22 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals
- 23 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to
