**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act making appropriations to the department of cultural  
2 affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa  
3 finance authority, the public employment relations board,  
4 the department of workforce development, and the state board  
5 of regents and certain regents institutions, and properly  
6 related matters.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS. There is  
2 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
3 department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning  
4 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amounts,  
5 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
6 designated:

7 1. ADMINISTRATION

8 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
9 purposes:

10 ..... \$ 170,162

11 The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate  
12 activities with the tourism office of the economic development  
13 authority to promote attendance at the state historical  
14 building and at this state's historic sites.

15 2. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS

16 For planning and programming for the community cultural  
17 grants program established under section 303.3:

18 ..... \$ 172,090

19 3. HISTORICAL DIVISION

20 For the support of the historical division:

21 ..... \$ 3,195,504

22 4. HISTORIC SITES

23 For the administration and support of historic sites:

24 ..... \$ 432,907

25 5. ARTS DIVISION

26 For the support of the arts division:

27 ..... \$ 1,429,005

28 Of the moneys appropriated in this paragraph, the department  
29 shall allocate \$400,000 for purposes of the film office.

30 6. IOWA GREAT PLACES

31 For the Iowa great places program established under section  
32 303.3C:

33 ..... \$ 151,232

34 7. CULTURAL TRUST GRANTS

35 For grant programs administered by the Iowa arts

1 council including those programs supporting the long-term  
2 financial stability and sustainability of nonprofit cultural  
3 organizations:

4 ..... \$ 150,000

5 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

6 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, the goals  
7 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and  
8 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and  
9 increase the population of the state.

10 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic  
11 development authority shall do all of the following for the  
12 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020:

13 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that  
14 result in commercially viable products and services.

15 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free  
16 market, private sector philosophies.

17 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the  
18 state.

19 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually  
20 improve the economic development climate along with the  
21 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

22 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they  
23 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

24 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to  
25 showcase Iowa’s workforce, existing industry, and potential.  
26 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,  
27 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.  
28 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through  
29 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks  
30 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small  
31 businesses.

32 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of  
33 life to foster economic growth.

34 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development  
35 through development, expansion, and modernization of

1 infrastructure.

2 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses  
3 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism  
4 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to  
5 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

6 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative  
7 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

8 Sec. 3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

9 1. APPROPRIATION

10 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
11 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
12 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
13 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
14 purposes designated in this subsection:

15 ..... \$ 13,898,101

16 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,  
17 programs, marketing, and the maintenance of an administration  
18 division, a business development division, a community  
19 development division, a small business development division,  
20 and other divisions the authority may organize.

21 (2) For business development operations and programs,  
22 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,  
23 and the partner state program.

24 (3) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section  
25 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure  
26 projects.

27 (4) For community economic development programs, tourism  
28 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps  
29 and summer youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet  
30 programs, the school-to-career program, the community  
31 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related  
32 programs.

33 (5) For achieving the goals and accountability, and  
34 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

35 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in

1 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
2 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
3 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this  
4 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

5 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

6 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in  
7 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring  
8 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are  
9 citizens of the United States who reside within the United  
10 States or any person authorized to work in the United States  
11 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the  
12 United States.

13 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in  
14 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and  
15 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the  
16 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who  
17 reside within the United States or any person authorized to  
18 work in the United States pursuant to federal law, including  
19 legal resident aliens in the United States.

20 c. A business that receives financial assistance from  
21 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall  
22 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this  
23 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided  
24 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received  
25 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals  
26 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to  
27 recapture by the authority.

28 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

29 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
30 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a  
31 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting  
32 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former  
33 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and  
34 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

35 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the

1 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage  
2 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

3 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
4 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of  
5 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and  
6 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,  
7 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

8 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in  
9 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance for  
10 the Iowa green streets pilot project or for any other program  
11 or project that involves the installation of geothermal systems  
12 for melting snow and ice from streets or sidewalks.

13 4. IOWA COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEER SERVICE

14 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
15 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
16 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
17 amount for allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer  
18 service for purposes of the Iowa state commission grant  
19 program, and the Iowa's promise and Iowa mentoring partnership  
20 programs:

21 ..... \$ 168,201

22 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the  
23 authority shall allocate \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa state  
24 commission grant program and \$93,201 for purposes of the Iowa's  
25 promise and Iowa mentoring partnership programs.

26 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
27 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close  
28 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available  
29 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of  
30 the succeeding fiscal year.

31 5. COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENTS — ASSISTANCE

32 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
33 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
34 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
35 amount to be used for the purposes of providing financial

1 assistance to Iowa's councils of governments:

2 ..... \$ 275,000

3 6. FUTURE READY IOWA REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP DEVELOPMENT  
4 PROGRAM

5 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
6 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
7 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
8 amount to be used for the funding of the future ready Iowa  
9 registered apprenticeship development program under chapter  
10 15C, to encourage small to midsize businesses to start or grow  
11 registered apprenticeships:

12 ..... \$ 1,600,000

13 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
14 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
15 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
16 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
17 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

18 7. SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS  
19 INTERNSHIPS

20 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
21 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the Iowa economic  
22 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
23 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amount, or so  
24 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

25 For the funding of internships for students studying in the  
26 fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics  
27 with eligible Iowa employers as provided in section 15.411,  
28 subsection 3, paragraph "c":

29 ..... \$ 1,000,000

30 b. No more than 3 percent of the moneys appropriated in this  
31 subsection may be used by the authority for costs associated  
32 with administration of the internship program.

33 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
34 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at  
35 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain

1 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in  
2 subsequent fiscal years.

3 8. FUTURE READY IOWA — VOLUNTEER MENTORING PROGRAM

4 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
5 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic  
6 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
7 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amount, or so  
8 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

9 For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer services  
10 to be used for further development of a volunteer mentor  
11 program to support implementation of the future ready Iowa  
12 skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship program in section  
13 261.131 and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant  
14 program created in section 261.132:

15 ..... \$ 400,000

16 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
17 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at  
18 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
19 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
20 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

21 9. EMPOWER RURAL IOWA — HOUSING NEEDS ASSESSMENT GRANT  
22 PROGRAM

23 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
24 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic  
25 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
26 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amount, or so  
27 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

28 To be distributed by the authority for establishing a  
29 housing needs assessment grant program to provide small  
30 communities with hard data and housing-related information  
31 specific to the community being analyzed:

32 ..... \$ 100,000

33 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
34 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at  
35 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain



1 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
2 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

3 c. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter  
4 17A to establish criteria for the distribution of the moneys  
5 appropriated in this subsection.

6 Sec. 4. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — FY  
7 2020-2021. Notwithstanding the standing appropriations  
8 in the following designated sections for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the amounts  
10 appropriated from the general fund of the state pursuant to  
11 these sections for the following purposes shall not exceed the  
12 following amounts:

13 1. For operational support grants and community cultural  
14 grants under section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d",  
15 subparagraph (1):

16 ..... \$ 448,403

17 2. For the purposes of regional tourism marketing under  
18 section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

19 ..... \$ 900,000

20 Sec. 5. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REPORTING — ECONOMIC  
21 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. The economic development authority and  
22 the department of revenue shall submit a joint annual report  
23 to the general assembly no later than November 1, 2020, that  
24 details the amount of every direct loan, forgivable loan,  
25 tax credit, tax exemption, tax refund, grant, or any other  
26 financial assistance awarded to a person during the prior  
27 fiscal year by the authority under an economic development  
28 program administered by the authority. The report shall  
29 identify the county where the project associated with each such  
30 award is located.

31 Sec. 6. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the  
32 moneys collected by the insurance division in excess of the  
33 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection  
34 3, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, \$100,000  
35 shall be transferred to the economic development authority for

1 insurance economic development and international insurance  
2 economic development.

3 Sec. 7. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

4 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
5 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning  
6 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amount,  
7 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to provide  
8 reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible persons under  
9 the home and community-based services rent subsidy program  
10 established in section 16.55:

11 ..... \$ 658,000

12 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, not more than  
13 \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

14 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
15 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
16 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
17 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
18 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

19 Sec. 8. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state  
20 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority  
21 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

22 Sec. 9. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD.

23 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
24 to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year  
25 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
26 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes  
27 designated:

28 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
29 purposes:

30 ..... \$ 1,509,978

31 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board  
32 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining an internet site that  
33 allows searchable access to a database of collective bargaining  
34 information.

35 Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There

1 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
2 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
3 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
4 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes  
5 designated:

6 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

7 a. For the division of labor services, including salaries,  
8 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

9 ..... \$ 3,535,270

10 b. From the contractor registration fees, the division of  
11 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections  
12 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under  
13 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

14 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

15 a. For the division of workers' compensation, including  
16 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

17 ..... \$ 3,463,124

18 b. The division of workers' compensation shall charge a  
19 \$100 filing fee for workers' compensation cases. The filing  
20 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However, the  
21 fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party, except  
22 in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be unjust  
23 under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the filing  
24 fee allowed under this subsection are appropriated to the  
25 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of  
26 administering the division of workers' compensation.

27 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

28 a. For the operation of field offices and the workforce  
29 development board:

30 ..... \$ 6,834,415

31 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" of this  
32 subsection, the department shall allocate \$150,000 to the state  
33 library for the purpose of licensing an online resource which  
34 prepares persons to succeed in the workplace through programs  
35 which improve job skills and vocational test-taking abilities.

1 4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

2 a. For the development and administration of an offender  
3 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills:  
4 ..... \$ 396,530

5 b. The department of workforce development shall partner  
6 with the department of corrections to provide staff within the  
7 correctional facilities to improve offenders' abilities to find  
8 and retain productive employment.

9 5. INTEGRATED INFORMATION FOR IOWA SYSTEM

10 For the payment of services provided by the department of  
11 administrative services related to the integrated information  
12 for Iowa system:  
13 ..... \$ 228,822

14 6. SUMMER YOUTH INTERN PILOT PROGRAM

15 For the funding of a summer youth intern pilot program that  
16 will help young people at risk of not graduating from high  
17 school to explore and prepare for high-demand careers through  
18 summer work experience, including the development of soft  
19 skills:  
20 ..... \$ 250,000

21 7. NONREVERSION

22 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
23 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of  
24 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for  
25 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the  
26 succeeding fiscal year.

27 Sec. 11. GENERAL FUND — EMPLOYEE MISCLASSIFICATION  
28 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
29 state to the department of workforce development for the fiscal  
30 year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the  
31 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
32 used for the purposes designated:

33 For enhancing efforts to investigate employers that  
34 misclassify workers:  
35 ..... \$ 384,496

1 Sec. 12. SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

2 1. There is appropriated from the special employment  
3 security contingency fund to the department of workforce  
4 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and  
5 ending June 30, 2021, the following amount, or so much thereof  
6 as is necessary, to be used for field offices:

7 ..... \$ 1,766,084

8 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue  
9 collected by the department of workforce development is  
10 appropriated to the department for the fiscal year beginning  
11 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, to accomplish the  
12 mission of the department.

13 Sec. 13. FUTURE READY IOWA — IOWA EMPLOYER INNOVATION FUND.

14 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
15 to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
16 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
17 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
18 purposes designated:

19 In consultation with the workforce development board, for  
20 funding of the Iowa employer innovation program which shall  
21 match eligible employer moneys to expand opportunities for  
22 education and training leading to high-demand jobs and to  
23 encourage Iowa employers, community leaders, and others to  
24 provide leadership and support for regional workforce talent  
25 pools throughout the state, and for future ready Iowa education  
26 and outreach:

27 ..... \$ 4,000,000

28 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, an amount  
29 to be determined by the department of workforce development  
30 in consultation with the workforce development board shall be  
31 transferred to the Iowa child care challenge fund.

32 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
33 this section which remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
34 end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
35 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the

1 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

2 Sec. 14. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND —  
3 FIELD OFFICES. Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 8,  
4 paragraph "e", there is appropriated from interest earned on  
5 the unemployment compensation reserve fund to the department  
6 of workforce development for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
7 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amount, or so  
8 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

9 For the operation of field offices:  
10 ..... \$ 2,850,000

11 Sec. 15. VIRTUAL ACCESS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OFFICES. The  
12 department of workforce development shall require a unique  
13 identification login for all users of workforce development  
14 centers operated through electronic means.

15 Sec. 16. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding  
16 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to  
17 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United  
18 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security  
19 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce  
20 development and shall be used by the department for the  
21 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.  
22 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year  
23 beginning after December 31, 2020.

24 Sec. 17. IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION FUND.

25 1. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
26 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the following  
27 departments, agencies, and institutions for the fiscal year  
28 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, the following  
29 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
30 purposes designated:

31 a. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

32 (1) For the purposes of providing assistance under the high  
33 quality jobs program as described in section 15.335B:

34 ..... \$ 12,100,000

35 (2) From the moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph

1 "a", the economic development authority may use not more  
2 than \$1,000,000 for purposes of providing infrastructure  
3 grants to mainstreet communities under the main street Iowa  
4 program and may allocate not more than \$300,000 for the  
5 purposes of supporting statewide worker education and quality  
6 preapprenticeship programs.

7 (3) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in  
8 this lettered paragraph "a", an entity shall testify upon the  
9 request of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic  
10 development regarding the expenditure of such moneys.

11 b. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS AND REGENTS INSTITUTIONS

12 (1) STATE BOARD OF REGENTS. For capacity building  
13 infrastructure in areas related to technology  
14 commercialization, marketing and business development  
15 efforts in areas related to technology commercialization,  
16 entrepreneurship, and business growth, and infrastructure  
17 projects and programs needed to assist in implementation of  
18 activities under chapter 262B:

19 ..... \$ 3,000,000

20 (a) Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to this  
21 subparagraph (1), 35 percent shall be allocated for Iowa state  
22 university of science and technology, 35 percent shall be  
23 allocated for the state university of Iowa, and 30 percent  
24 shall be allocated for the university of northern Iowa.

25 (b) The institutions shall provide a one-to-one match  
26 of additional moneys for the activities funded with moneys  
27 appropriated under this subparagraph (1).

28 (c) The state board of regents shall submit a report by  
29 January 15, 2021, to the governor, the general assembly, and  
30 the legislative services agency regarding the activities,  
31 projects, and programs funded with moneys appropriated under  
32 this subparagraph (1). The report shall be provided in an  
33 electronic format and shall include a list of metrics and  
34 criteria mutually agreed to in advance by the board of regents  
35 and the economic development authority. The metrics and

1 criteria shall allow the governor's office and the general  
2 assembly to quantify and evaluate the progress of the board of  
3 regents institutions with regard to their activities, projects,  
4 and programs in the areas of technology commercialization,  
5 entrepreneurship, regional development, and market research.

6 (2) IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. For  
7 small business development centers, the science and technology

8 This bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2020-2021  
9 from the general fund of the state to the department of  
10 cultural affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa  
11 finance authority, the public employment relations board, the  
12 department of workforce development, Iowa state university of  
13 science and technology, the state university of Iowa, and the  
14 university of northern Iowa.

15 The bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2020-2021  
16 from the Iowa skilled worker and job creation fund created in  
17 Code section 8.75 to the economic development authority, the  
18 department of workforce development, and the state board of  
19 regents and institutions under the control of the board.

20 For the fiscal year 2020-2021, the bill limits standing  
21 appropriations established in the Code for certain operational  
22 support grants, community cultural grants, and regional tourism  
23 marketing.

24 The bill transfers \$100,000 of the moneys collected by the  
25 insurance division in excess of the anticipated gross revenues  
26 under Code section 505.7 to the economic development authority.

27 The bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2020-2021
