A BILL FOR

1 An Act making appropriations to the department of cultural
2 affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa
3 finance authority, the public employment relations board,
4 the department of workforce development, and the state board
5 of regents and certain regents institutions, and providing
6 for properly related matters.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I
FY 2021-2022

Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. ADMINISTRATION

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

..... \$ 168,637

The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate activities with the tourism office of the economic development authority to promote attendance at the state historical building and at the state's historic sites.

2. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS

For planning and programming for the community cultural grants program established under section 303.3:

..... \$ 172,090

3. HISTORICAL DIVISION

For the support of the historical division:

..... \$ 3,142,351

4. HISTORIC SITES

For the administration and support of historic sites:

..... \$ 426,398

5. ARTS DIVISION

For the support of the arts division:

..... \$ 1,317,188

Of the moneys appropriated in this paragraph, the department shall allocate \$300,000 for purposes of the film office.

6. IOWA GREAT PLACES

For the Iowa great places program established under section 303.3C:

..... \$ 150,000

1 7. CULTURAL TRUST GRANTS

2 For grant programs administered by the Iowa arts
3 council including those programs supporting the long-term
4 financial stability and sustainability of nonprofit cultural
5 organizations:

6 \$ 150,000

7 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

8 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, the goals
9 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and
10 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and
11 increase the population of the state.

12 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic
13 development authority shall do all of the following for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021:

15 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that
16 result in commercially viable products and services.

17 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free
18 market, private sector philosophies.

19 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the
20 state.

21 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually
22 improve the economic development climate along with the
23 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

24 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they
25 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

26 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to
27 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential.
28 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,
29 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.
30 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through
31 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks
32 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small
33 businesses.

34 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of
35 life to foster economic growth.

1 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development
2 through development, expansion, and modernization of
3 infrastructure.

4 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses
5 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism
6 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to
7 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

8 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative
9 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

10 Sec. 3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

11 1. APPROPRIATION

12 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
13 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
14 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
15 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
16 purposes designated in this subsection:

17 \$ 13,318,553

18 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,
19 programs, marketing, and the maintenance of an administration
20 division, a business development division, a community
21 development division, a small business development division,
22 and other divisions the authority may organize.

23 (2) For business development operations and programs,
24 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,
25 and the partner state program.

26 (3) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section
27 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure
28 projects.

29 (4) For community economic development programs, tourism
30 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps
31 and summer youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet
32 programs, the school-to-career program, the community
33 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related
34 programs.

35 (5) For achieving the goals and accountability, and

1 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this
2 division of this Act.

3 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
4 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
5 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
6 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this
7 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

8 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

9 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in
10 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring
11 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are
12 citizens of the United States who reside within the United
13 States, or any person authorized to work in the United States
14 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens
15 residing in the United States.

16 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in
17 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and
18 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the
19 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who
20 reside within the United States, or any person authorized to
21 work in the United States pursuant to federal law, including
22 legal resident aliens residing in the United States.

23 c. A business that receives financial assistance from
24 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall
25 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this
26 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided
27 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received
28 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals
29 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to
30 recapture by the authority.

31 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

32 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
33 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a
34 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting
35 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former

1 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and
2 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

3 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
4 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage
5 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

6 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
7 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of
8 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and
9 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,
10 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

11 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in
12 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance for
13 the Iowa green streets pilot project or for any other program
14 or project that involves the installation of geothermal systems
15 for melting snow and ice from streets or sidewalks.

16 4. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

17 In lieu of the standing appropriation in section 15.368,
18 there is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
19 economic development authority for the fiscal year beginning
20 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount
21 for the world food prize:

22 \$ 375,000

23 5. IOWA COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEER SERVICE

24 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
25 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
26 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
27 amount for allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer
28 service for purposes of the Iowa state commission grant
29 program, and the Iowa's promise and Iowa mentoring partnership
30 programs:

31 \$ 168,201

32 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
33 authority shall allocate \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa state
34 commission grant program and \$93,201 for purposes of the Iowa's
35 promise and Iowa mentoring partnership programs.

1 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
2 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close
3 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available
4 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of
5 the succeeding fiscal year.

6 6. COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENTS — ASSISTANCE

7 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
8 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
9 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
10 amount to be used for the purposes of providing financial
11 assistance to Iowa’s councils of governments:

12 \$ 275,000

13 7. FUTURE READY IOWA REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP DEVELOPMENT
14 PROGRAM

15 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
16 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
18 amount to be used for the funding of the future ready Iowa
19 registered apprenticeship development program under chapter
20 15C, to encourage small to midsize businesses to start or grow
21 registered apprenticeships:

22 \$ 1,000,000

23 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
24 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
25 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
26 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
27 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

28 8. SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS
29 INTERNSHIPS

30 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
31 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the Iowa economic
32 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
33 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so
34 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

35 For the funding of internships for students studying in the

1 fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics
2 with eligible Iowa employers as provided in section 15.411,
3 subsection 3, paragraph "c":

4 \$ 1,000,000

5 b. No more than 3 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
6 subsection may be used by the authority for costs associated
7 with administration of the internship program.

8 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
9 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
10 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
11 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in
12 subsequent fiscal years.

13 9. FUTURE READY IOWA — VOLUNTEER MENTORING PROGRAM

14 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
15 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic
16 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
17 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so
18 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

19 For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer services
20 to be used for further development of a volunteer mentor
21 program to support implementation of the future ready Iowa
22 skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship program in section
23 261.131 and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant
24 program created in section 261.132:

25 \$ 400,000

26 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
27 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
28 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
29 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
30 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

31 10. STEM BEST AND EMPOWER RURAL IOWA

32 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
33 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic
34 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
35 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amounts, or so

1 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

2 STEM Best:

3 \$ 700,000

4 Empower Rural Iowa Program:

5 \$ 700,000

6 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
7 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
8 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
9 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 c. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
12 17A to establish criteria for the distribution of the moneys
13 appropriated in this subsection.

14 Sec. 4. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — FY
15 2021-2022. Notwithstanding the standing appropriations
16 in the following designated sections for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the amounts
18 appropriated from the general fund of the state pursuant to
19 these sections for the following purposes shall not exceed the
20 following amounts:

21 1. For operational support grants and community cultural
22 grants under section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d",
23 subparagraph (1):

24 \$ 448,403

25 2. For the purposes of regional tourism marketing under
26 section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

27 \$ 900,000

28 Sec. 5. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REPORTING — ECONOMIC
29 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. The economic development authority and
30 the department of revenue shall submit a joint annual report
31 to the general assembly no later than November 1, 2021, that
32 details the amount of every direct loan, forgivable loan,
33 tax credit, tax exemption, tax refund, grant, or any other
34 financial assistance awarded to a person during the prior
35 fiscal year by the authority under an economic development

1 program administered by the authority. The report shall
2 identify the county where the project associated with each such
3 award is located.

4 Sec. 6. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the
5 moneys collected by the insurance division in excess of the
6 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection
7 3, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, \$100,000
8 shall be transferred to the economic development authority for
9 insurance economic development and international insurance
10 economic development.

11 Sec. 7. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

12 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
13 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount,
15 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to provide
16 reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible persons under
17 the home and community-based services rent subsidy program
18 established in section 16.55:

19 \$ 658,000

20 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, not more than
21 \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

22 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
23 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
24 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
25 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
26 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

27 Sec. 8. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state
28 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority
29 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

30 Sec. 9. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD.

31 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
32 to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year
33 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
34 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
35 designated:

1 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
2 purposes:

3 \$ 1,492,452

4 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board
5 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining an internet site that
6 allows access to a searchable database of collective bargaining
7 information.

8 Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There
9 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
10 department of workforce development for the fiscal year
11 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
12 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
13 designated:

14 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

15 a. For the division of labor services, including salaries,
16 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

17 \$ 3,491,252

18 b. From the contractor registration fees, the division of
19 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections
20 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under
21 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

22 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

23 a. For the division of workers' compensation, including
24 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

25 \$ 3,321,044

26 b. The division of workers' compensation shall charge a
27 \$100 filing fee for workers' compensation cases. The filing
28 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However, the
29 fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party, except
30 in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be unjust
31 under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the filing
32 fee allowed under this subsection are appropriated to the
33 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of
34 administering the division of workers' compensation.

35 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

1 a. For the operation of field offices and the workforce
2 development board:
3 \$ 6,675,650

4 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" of this
5 subsection, the department shall allocate \$150,000 to the state
6 library for the purpose of licensing an online resource which
7 prepares persons to succeed in the workplace through programs
8 which improve job skills and vocational test-taking abilities.

9 4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

10 a. For the development and administration of an offender
11 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills:
12 \$ 387,158

13 b. The department of workforce development shall partner
14 with the department of corrections to provide staff within the
15 correctional facilities to improve offenders' abilities to find
16 and retain productive employment.

17 5. INTEGRATED INFORMATION FOR IOWA SYSTEM

18 For the payment of services provided by the department of
19 administrative services related to the integrated information
20 for Iowa system:
21 \$ 228,822

22 6. SUMMER YOUTH INTERN PILOT PROGRAM

23 For the funding of a summer youth intern pilot program that
24 will help young people at risk of not graduating from high
25 school to explore and prepare for high-demand careers through
26 summer work experience, including the development of soft
27 skills:
28 \$ 250,000

29 7. HOME BASE IOWA

30 For the support of home base Iowa:
31 \$ 250,000

32 8. NONREVERSION

33 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
34 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of
35 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for

1 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the
2 succeeding fiscal year.

3 Sec. 11. GENERAL FUND — EMPLOYEE MISCLASSIFICATION
4 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
5 state to the department of workforce development for the fiscal
6 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the
7 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
8 used for the purposes designated:

9 For enhancing efforts to investigate employers that
10 misclassify workers:

11 \$ 379,631

12 Sec. 12. SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

13 1. There is appropriated from the special employment
14 security contingency fund to the department of workforce
15 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and
16 ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so much thereof
17 as is necessary, to be used for field offices:

18 \$ 1,766,084

19 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue
20 collected by the department of workforce development is
21 appropriated to the department for the fiscal year beginning
22 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, to accomplish the
23 mission of the department.

24 Sec. 13. FUTURE READY IOWA — IOWA EMPLOYER INNOVATION FUND.

25 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
26 to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year
27 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
28 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
29 purposes designated:

30 In consultation with the workforce development board, for
31 funding of the Iowa employer innovation program which shall
32 match eligible employer moneys to expand opportunities for
33 education and training leading to high-demand jobs and to
34 encourage Iowa employers, community leaders, and others to
35 provide leadership and support for regional workforce talent

1 pools throughout the state, and for future ready Iowa education
2 and outreach:

3 \$ 4,200,000

4 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, an amount
5 to be determined by the department of workforce development
6 in consultation with the workforce development board shall be
7 transferred to the Iowa child care challenge fund.

8 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
9 this section which remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
10 end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
11 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
12 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

13 Sec. 14. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND —
14 FIELD OFFICES. Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 8,
15 paragraph "e", there is appropriated from interest earned on
16 the unemployment compensation reserve fund to the department
17 of workforce development for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
18 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so
19 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

20 For the operation of field offices:
21 \$ 2,850,000

22 Sec. 15. VIRTUAL ACCESS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OFFICES. The
23 department of workforce development shall require a unique
24 identification login for all users of workforce development
25 centers operated through electronic means.

26 Sec. 16. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding
27 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to
28 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United
29 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security
30 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce
31 development and shall be used by the department for the
32 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.
33 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year
34 beginning after December 31, 2021.

35 Sec. 17. IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION FUND.

1 1. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
2 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the following
3 departments, agencies, and institutions for the fiscal year
4 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
5 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
6 purposes designated:

7 a. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

8 (1) For the purposes of providing assistance as described in
9 section 15.335B for the high quality jobs program:

10 \$ 11,700,000

11 (2) From the moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
12 "a", the economic development authority may use not more
13 than \$1,000,000 for purposes of providing infrastructure
14 grants to mainstreet communities under the main street Iowa
15 program and may allocate not more than \$300,000 for the
16 purposes of supporting statewide worker education and quality
17 preapprenticeship programs.

18 (3) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in
19 this lettered paragraph "a", an entity shall testify upon the
20 request of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic
21 development regarding the expenditure of such moneys.

22 b. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS AND REGENTS INSTITUTIONS

23 (1) STATE BOARD OF REGENTS. For capacity building
24 infrastructure in areas related to technology
25 commercialization, marketing and business development
26 efforts in areas related to technology commercialization,
27 entrepreneurship, and business growth, and infrastructure
28 projects and programs needed to assist in implementation of
29 activities under chapter 262B:

30 \$ 3,000,000

31 (a) Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to this
32 subparagraph (1), 35 percent shall be allocated for Iowa state
33 university of science and technology, 35 percent shall be
34 allocated for the state university of Iowa, and 30 percent
35 shall be allocated for the university of northern Iowa.

1 (b) The institutions shall provide a one-to-one match
2 of additional moneys for the activities funded with moneys
3 appropriated under this subparagraph (1).

4 (c) The state board of regents shall submit a report by
5 January 15, 2022, to the governor, the general assembly, and
6 the legislative services agency regarding the activities,
7 projects, and programs funded with moneys appropriated under
8 this subparagraph (1). The report shall be provided in an
9 electronic format and shall include a list of metrics and
10 criteria mutually agreed to in advance by the board of regents
11 and the economic development authority. The metrics and
12 criteria shall allow the governor's office and the general
13 assembly to quantify and evaluate the progress of the board of
14 regents institutions with regard to their activities, projects,
15 and programs in the areas of technology commercialization,
16 entrepreneurship, regional development, and market research.

17 (2) IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. For
18 small business development centers, the research park, and the
19 center for industrial research and service:
20 \$ 2,424,302

21 (a) Of the moneys appropriated in this subparagraph (2),
22 Iowa state university of science and technology shall allocate
23 at least \$735,728 for purposes of funding small business
24 development centers. Iowa state university of science and
25 technology may allocate the appropriated moneys to the various
26 small business development centers in any manner necessary to
27 achieve the purposes of this subparagraph.

28 (b) Iowa state university of science and technology shall
29 do all of the following:

30 (i) Direct expenditures for research toward projects that
31 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

32 (ii) Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based
33 companies.

34 (c) It is the intent of the general assembly that the
35 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial sectors

1 and seek contributions and in-kind donations from businesses,
2 industrial foundations, and trade associations, and that moneys
3 for the center for industrial research and service industrial
