A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations involving state
2 government entities involved with agriculture, natural
3 resources, and environmental protection.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP
GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For purposes of supporting the department, including its divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
..... \$ 18,538,194

2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, the following amount is transferred to Iowa state university of science and technology, to be used for the university's midwest grape and wine industry institute:
..... \$ 288,000

3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department of management, the members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated in this section to support the department's administration, regulation, and programs.

DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS
MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS

Sec. 2. UNCLAIMED PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING WINNINGS — HORSE AND DOG RACING. There is appropriated from the moneys available under section 99D.13 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes

1 designated:

2 For purposes of supporting the department's administration
3 and enforcement of horse and dog racing law pursuant to section
4 99D.22, including for salaries, support, maintenance, and
5 miscellaneous purposes:

6 \$ 305,516

7 Sec. 3. RENEWABLE FUEL INFRASTRUCTURE FUND — MOTOR
8 FUEL INSPECTION. There is appropriated from the renewable
9 fuel infrastructure fund created in section 159A.16 to the
10 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
11 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the
12 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
13 used for the purposes designated:

14 For purposes of the inspection of motor fuel, including
15 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

16 \$ 500,000

17 SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS

18 GENERAL FUND

19 Sec. 4. DAIRY REGULATION.

20 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
21 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
22 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
23 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
24 used for the purposes designated:

25 For purposes of performing functions pursuant to section
26 192.109, including conducting a survey of grade "A" milk and
27 certifying the results to the secretary of agriculture:

28 \$ 189,196

29 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
30 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
31 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
32 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
33 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

34 Sec. 5. LOCAL FOOD AND FARM PROGRAM.

35 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state

1 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
2 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
3 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
4 used for the purposes designated:

5 For purposes of supporting the local food and farm program
6 pursuant to chapter 267A:

7 \$ 75,000

8 2. The department shall enter into a cost-sharing agreement
9 with Iowa state university of science and technology to support
10 the local food and farm program coordinator position as part of
11 the university's cooperative extension service in agriculture
12 and home economics pursuant to chapter 267A.

13 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
14 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
15 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
16 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
17 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

18 Sec. 6. AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

19 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
20 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
22 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
23 used for the purposes designated:

24 For purposes of allocating moneys to an Iowa association
25 affiliated with a national organization which promotes
26 agricultural education providing for future farmers:

27 \$ 25,000

28 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
29 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
30 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
31 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
32 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

33 Sec. 7. FOREIGN ANIMAL DISEASES AFFLICTING LIVESTOCK.

34 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
35 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal

1 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the
2 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
3 used for the purposes designated:

4 For deposit in the foreign animal disease preparedness and
5 response fund created in section 163.3B:

6 \$ 750,000

7 Sec. 8. FARMERS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

8 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
9 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
10 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
11 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
12 used for the purposes designated:

13 For purposes of supporting a program for farmers with
14 disabilities:

15 \$ 180,000

16 2. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for
17 the public purpose of providing a grant to a national nonprofit
18 organization with over 80 years of experience in assisting
19 children and adults with disabilities and special needs. The
20 moneys shall be used to support a nationally recognized program
21 that began in 1986 and has been replicated in at least 30 other
22 states, but which is not available through any other entity
23 in this state, and that provides assistance to farmers with
24 disabilities in all 99 counties to allow the farmers to remain
25 in their own homes and be gainfully engaged in farming through
26 provision of agricultural worksite and home modification
27 consultations, peer support services, services to families,
28 information and referral, and equipment loan services.

29 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
30 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
31 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
32 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
33 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

34 Sec. 9. LOESS HILLS DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION FUND.

35 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state

1 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
2 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
3 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
4 used for the purposes designated:

5 For deposit in the loess hills development and conservation
6 fund created pursuant to section 161D.2:

7 \$ 400,000

8 2. a. Of the amount appropriated to the loess hills
9 development and conservation fund in subsection 1, \$360,000
10 shall be allocated to the fund's hungry canyons account.

11 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated to the
12 fund's hungry canyons account as provided in paragraph "a" may
13 be used for administrative costs.

14 3. a. Of the amount appropriated to the loess hills
15 development and conservation fund in subsection 1, \$40,000
16 shall be allocated to the fund's loess hills alliance account.

17 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated to the
18 fund's loess hills alliance account as provided in paragraph
19 "a" may be used for administrative costs.

20 Sec. 10. SOUTHERN IOWA DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION FUND.

21 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
22 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
24 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
25 used for the purposes designated:

26 For deposit in the southern Iowa development and
27 conservation fund created pursuant to section 161D.12:

28 \$ 250,000

29 2. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
30 to the fund as provided in subsection 1 may be used for
31 administrative costs.

32 Sec. 11. GRAIN REGULATION. There is appropriated from the
33 general fund of the state to the department of agriculture
34 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
35 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so

1 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
2 designated:

3 For the administration and enforcement of chapters 203
4 and 203C, including salaries, support, maintenance, and
5 miscellaneous purposes:

6 \$ 350,000

7 Sec. 12. VALUE ADDED AGRICULTURE GRANT PROGRAM. There
8 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
9 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
10 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the
11 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
12 used for the purposes designated:

13 For the administration and execution of a value added
14 agriculture grant program to identify, evaluate, and support
15 programs and services which add value to agriculture products,
16 enable new technology, and support marketing strategies:

17 \$ 500,000

18 DIVISION II

19 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

20 WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE

21 Sec. 13. WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE — GENERAL FUND.

22 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
23 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
24 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
25 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
26 used for the purposes designated:

27 For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created in
28 section 466B.45, for purposes of supporting the water quality
29 initiative administered by the division of soil conservation
30 and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, including
31 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

32 \$ 3,000,000

33 2. a. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be
34 used to support projects in subwatersheds as designated by the
35 division that are part of high-priority watersheds identified

1 by the water resources coordinating council established
2 pursuant to section 466B.3.

3 b. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used to
4 support projects in watersheds generally, including regional
5 watersheds, as designated by the division and high-priority
6 watersheds identified by the water resources coordinating
7 council established pursuant to section 466B.3.

8 3. In supporting projects in subwatersheds and watersheds
9 as provided in subsection 2, all of the following apply:

10 a. The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
11 practices as described in the Iowa nutrient reduction strategy
12 as defined in section 455B.171.

13 b. The division shall implement demonstration projects as
14 provided in paragraph "a" by providing for participation by
15 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in
16 farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide
17 for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a
18 legal interest in agricultural land located within the same
19 subwatershed.

20 c. The division shall implement a demonstration project on
21 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,
22 except for edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the
23 amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of
24 establishing the practice as determined by the division or
25 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing the practice,
26 whichever is less.

27 d. The demonstration projects shall be used to educate other
28 persons about the feasibility and value of establishing similar
29 water quality practices. The division shall promote field day
30 events for purposes of allowing interested persons to establish
31 water quality practices on their agricultural land.

32 e. The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
33 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
34 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the
35 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality

1 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
2 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
3 land shall be a confidential record under section 22.7.

4 4. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used
5 to support education and outreach in a manner that encourages
6 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used for
7 farming to implement water quality practices, including the
8 establishment of such practices in watersheds generally, and
9 not limited to subwatersheds or high-priority watersheds.

10 5. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used
11 to contract with persons to coordinate the implementation of
12 efforts provided in this section.

13 6. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used by
14 the department to support urban soil and water conservation
15 efforts, which may include but are not limited to management
16 practices related to bioretention, landscaping, the use of
17 permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality restoration.
18 The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share basis as provided
19 in chapter 161A.

20 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
21 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in
22 subsection 1 to carry out the provisions of this section on a
23 cost-share basis in combination with other moneys available to
24 the department from a state or federal source.

25 8. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
26 this section may be used to pay for the costs of administering
27 and implementing the water quality initiative by the
28 department's division of soil conservation and water quality as
29 provided in section 466B.42 and this section.

30 DIVISION III

31 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

32 Sec. 14. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

33 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
34 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
35 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following

1 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
2 purposes designated:

3 For purposes of supporting the department, including its
4 divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; and
5 for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
6 \$ 12,093,061

7 2. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the
8 fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department
9 of management, the members of the joint appropriations
10 subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the
11 chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house
12 committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in
13 detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated under this
14 section to support the department's administration, regulation,
15 and programs.

16 Sec. 15. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND — REGULATION
17 AND ADVANCEMENT OF OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES.

18 1. There is appropriated from the state fish and game
19 protection fund created pursuant to section 456A.17 to the
20 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
21 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount,
22 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
23 designated:

24 For purposes of supporting the regulation or advancement of
25 hunting, fishing, or trapping, or the protection, propagation,
26 restoration, management, or harvest of fish or wildlife,
27 including for administration, regulation, law enforcement, and
28 programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,
29 and miscellaneous purposes:
30 \$ 47,541,987

31 2. Notwithstanding section 455A.10, the department may use
32 the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish and game
33 protection fund to provide for the funding of health and life
34 insurance premium payments from unused sick leave balances of
35 conservation peace officers employed in a protection occupation

1 who retire, pursuant to section 97B.49B.

2 3. Notwithstanding section 455A.10, the department of
3 natural resources may use the unappropriated balance remaining
4 in the state fish and game protection fund for the fiscal
5 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, as is
6 necessary to fund salary adjustments for departmental employees
7 for which the general assembly has made an operating budget
8 appropriation in subsection 1.

9 Sec. 16. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — WATER
10 QUALITY. There is appropriated from the groundwater protection
11 fund created in section 455E.11 to the department of natural
12 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022,
13 and ending June 30, 2023, from those moneys which are not
14 allocated pursuant to that section, the following amount, or
15 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
16 designated:

17 For purposes of supporting the department’s protection
18 of the state’s groundwater, including for administration,
19 regulation, and programs, and for salaries, support,
20 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:
21 \$ 3,455,850

22 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS

23 MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS

24 Sec. 17. SPECIAL SNOWMOBILE FUND — SNOWMOBILE
25 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the special snowmobile
26 fund created under section 321G.7 to the department of natural
27 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
28 ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof
29 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

30 For purposes of administering and enforcing the state
31 snowmobile programs:
32 \$ 100,000

33 Sec. 18. UNASSIGNED REVENUE FUND — UNDERGROUND STORAGE
34 TANKS SECTION EXPENSES. There is appropriated from the
35 unassigned revenue fund administered by the Iowa comprehensive

1 petroleum underground storage tank fund board established
2 pursuant to section 455G.4 to the department of natural
3 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
4 ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof
5 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

6 For purposes of paying for administration expenses of the
7 department's underground storage tanks section:

8 \$ 200,000

9 SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS

10 GENERAL FUND

11 Sec. 19. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT AND DAM SAFETY.

12 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
13 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
14 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following
15 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
16 purposes designated:

17 For purposes of supporting floodplain management and dam
18 safety:

19 \$ 1,510,000

20 2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, up to
21 \$400,000 may be used by the department to acquire or install
22 stream gages for purposes of tracking and predicting flood
23 events and for compiling necessary data to improve flood
24 frequency analysis.

25 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
26 subsection 1 that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
27 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
28 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
29 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

30 Sec. 20. FORESTRY HEALTH MANAGEMENT.

31 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
32 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
33 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following
34 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
35 purposes designated:

1 For purposes of providing for forestry health management
2 programs:

3 \$ 500,000

4 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
5 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
6 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
7 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
8 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

9 Sec. 21. STATE PARK OPERATIONS. There is appropriated from
10 the general fund of the state to the department of natural
11 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
12 ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof
13 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

14 For supporting operations at state parks, including
15 maintenance and repair of grounds and facilities:

16 \$ 1,000,000

17 DIVISION IV

18 IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

19 SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS

20 Sec. 22. VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY.

21 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
22 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
24 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
25 used for the purposes designated:

26 For purposes of supporting the college of veterinary
27 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic
28 laboratory:

29 \$ 4,400,000

30 2. a. Iowa state university of science and technology
31 shall not reduce the amount that it allocates to support the
32 college of veterinary medicine from any other source due to the
33 appropriation made in this section.

34 b. Paragraph "a" does not apply to a reduction made to
35 support the college of veterinary medicine, if the same

1 percentage of reduction imposed on the college of veterinary
2 medicine is also imposed on all of Iowa state university of
3 science and technology's budget units.

4 3. If by June 30, 2023, Iowa state university of science and
5 technology fails to allocate the moneys appropriated in this
6 section to the college of veterinary medicine in accordance
7 with this section, the moneys appropriated in this section for
8 that fiscal year shall revert to the general fund of the state.

9 Sec. 23. LIVESTOCK DISEASE RESEARCH.

10 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
11 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the
12 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
13 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
14 used for the purposes designated:

15 For deposit in the livestock disease research fund created
16 in section 267.8:

17 \$ 170,390

18 2. Moneys appropriated under subsection 1 shall be used
19 by Iowa state university of science and technology to support
20 animal disease research in areas of importance to livestock
21 producers.

22 DIVISION V

23 STATE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

24 SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION

25 AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

26 Sec. 24. IOWA'S CENTER FOR AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH
27 (I-CASH).

28 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
29 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning
30 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount,
31 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
32 designated:

33 For supporting the operations of Iowa's center for
34 agricultural safety and health, as part of the university's
35 college of public health, and in cooperation with the

1 department of agriculture and land stewardship, to anticipate,
2 recognize, and prevent occupational illness and injury among
3 members of the agricultural community:

4 \$ 128,154

5 2. a. As a condition of the appropriation made in
6 subsection 1, the state university of Iowa shall retain the
7 director of Iowa’s center for agricultural safety and health
8 employed on the effective date of this division of this Act for
9 at least the same number of hours for the fiscal year beginning
10 July 1, 2022, as worked by the director during the fiscal year
11 beginning July 1, 2021.

12 b. As a condition of the appropriation made in subsection
13 1, the state university of Iowa shall not reduce the amount
14 allocated to support Iowa’s center for agricultural safety from
15 any other source due to the appropriation made in subsection 1.

16 3. If by June 30, 2023, the state university of Iowa fails
17 to use the moneys appropriated in subsection 1 in accordance
18 with the purposes and conditions of subsections 1 and 2, any
19 unencumbered or unobligated moneys appropriated in subsection
20 1 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June
21 30, 2023, shall revert to the general fund of the state. In
22 addition, if moneys are required to be reverted pursuant to
23 section 8.33, the state university of Iowa shall transfer to
24 the general fund of the state from any otherwise unencumbered
25 or unobligated moneys from any other general fund appropriation
26 or from any moneys available from other funding sources an
27 amount equal to the amount appropriated in subsection 1 less
28 any amount reverted to the general fund of the state pursuant
29 to section 8.33.

30 DIVISION VI

31 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND

32 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

33 Sec. 25. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND
34 STEWARDSHIP. There is appropriated from the environment first
35 fund created in section 8.57A to the department of agriculture

1 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
2 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amounts, or so
3 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
4 designated:

5 1. CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)

6 a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to
7 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of intercepting
8 tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss, improving water
9 quality, and enhancing agricultural production practices:

10 \$ 1,000,000

11 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
12 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
13 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

14 c. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
15 department may use moneys appropriated in this subsection,
16 in combination with other appropriate environment first
17 fund appropriations, for cost sharing to match United States
18 department of agriculture, natural resources conservation
19 service, wetlands reserve enhancement program (WREP) funding
20 available to Iowa.

21 2. WATERSHED PROTECTION

22 a. For continuation of a program that provides
23 multiobjective resource protections for flood control, water
24 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:

25 \$ 900,000

26 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
27 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
28 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

26 30, 2023, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
27 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

7 For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created in
8 section 466B.45, for purposes of supporting the water quality
9 initiative administered by the division of soil conservation
10 and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, including
11 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

13 2. a. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be
14 used to support projects in subwatersheds as designated by the
15 division that are part of high-priority watersheds identified
16 by the water resources coordinating council established
17 pursuant to section 466B.3.

18 b. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used to
19 support projects in watersheds generally, including regional
20 watersheds, as designated by the division and high-priority
21 watersheds identified by the water resources coordinating
22 council established pursuant to section 466B.3.

23 3. In supporting projects in subwatersheds and watersheds
24 as provided in subsection 2, all of the following apply:

25 a. The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
26 practices as described in the Iowa nutrient reduction strategy
27 as defined in section 455B.171.

28 b. The division shall implement demonstration projects as
29 provided in paragraph "a" by providing for participation by
30 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in
31 farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide
32 for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a
33 legal interest in agricultural land located within the same
34 subwatershed.

35 c. The division shall implement a demonstration project on

1 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,
2 except for edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the
3 amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of
4 establishing the practice as determined by the division or
5 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing the practice,
6 whichever is less.

7 d. The demonstration projects shall be used to educate other
8 persons about the feasibility and value of establishing similar

23 allocated to the open spaces account of the Iowa resources
24 enhancement and protection fund, up to \$1,000,000 may be
25 used by the department of natural resources for state park
26 maintenance and repair for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
27 2022, and ending on June 30, 2023.

28 EXPLANATION

29 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
30 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

31 GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural
32 resources by making appropriations for the fiscal year
33 2022-2023 to support related entities, including the department
34 of agriculture and land stewardship (DALs), the department of
35 natural resources (DNR), Iowa state university (ISU), and the

1 university of Iowa (UI).

2 The bill primarily appropriates moneys to DALs and DNR.
3 The appropriations are made to support those departments for
4 administration, regulation, and support of programs. The bill
5 requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to the
6 general assembly and department of management regarding the
7 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
8 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered
9 by those departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a
10 number of sources, including the general fund of the state
11 (general fund), the state fish and game protection fund, the
12 groundwater protection fund, and the environment first fund
13 (EFF). Appropriations are made from a number of sources to
14 support the water quality initiative (WQI).

15 DALs — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill appropriates
16 moneys to DALs from the general fund in order to support its
17 administrative divisions, including consumer protection and
18 industry services, soil conservation, and food safety and
19 animal health. Moneys are transferred to ISU to support its
20 midwest grape and wine industry institute.

21 DALs — MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS — DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS.
22 The bill appropriates moneys from several sources to support a
23 number of designated purposes, including moneys derived from
24 unclaimed winnings from horse and dog races, for administration
25 and enforcement of racing regulations; and moneys credited
26 to the renewable fuel infrastructure fund, for purposes of
27 regulating motor fuel.

28 DALs — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
29 makes special appropriations from the general fund to DALs in
30 order to support specific purposes including milk inspection,
31 the local food and farm program, an agricultural education
32 organization, foreign animal disease preparedness, assistance
33 to farmers with disabilities, loess hills protections, southern
34 Iowa development and conservation, grain regulation, and a
35 value added agriculture grant program.

1 DALS — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS — WATER QUALITY. The
2 bill appropriates moneys from the general fund to DALS for
3 deposit in the water quality initiative fund, to support the
4 WQI including high-priority watershed projects.

5 DNR — GENERAL FUND AND OTHER MAJOR FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS.
6 The bill makes appropriations from a number of funds to DNR in
7 order to support its administrative divisions involving natural
8 resources and environmental protection from the general fund,
9 the state fish and game protection fund, and the groundwater
10 protection fund.

11 DNR — MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS — DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS.
12 The bill appropriates moneys to DNR from a number of sources
13 to support designated purposes, including moneys deposited in
14 the special snowmobile fund to provide for administering and
15 enforcing the state snowmobile programs; and moneys deposited
16 in the unassigned revenue fund for purposes of paying for
17 administration of DNR's underground storage tanks section.

18 DNR — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes
19 special appropriations from the general fund to DNR in order
20 to support specific purposes including floodplain management,
21 dam safety and forestry health management programs, and state
22 parks.

23 ISU — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
24 appropriates moneys from the general fund to ISU to support the
25 operation of its veterinary diagnostic laboratory and livestock
26 disease research.

27 UI — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes
28 appropriations from the general fund to UI to support the
29 operations of Iowa's center for agricultural safety and health
30 which is part of UI's college of public health.

31 DALS, DNR, AND UI — EFF — GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS. The
32 bill appropriates moneys from the EFF to support a number of
33 programs administered by DALS, DNR, and UI. For DALS, the
34 moneys are appropriated to support programs involving soil
35 conservation, watershed protection and nutrient management,

1 and the loess hills development and conservation fund. For
2 DNR, moneys are appropriated to support programs involving
3 state parks, geographic information systems, water quality
4 monitoring, public water supplies, regulation of animal feeding
5 operations, air quality, and floodplain management and dam
6 safety. For UI, moneys are appropriated to support the Iowa
7 geological survey. The bill includes provisions that delay the
8 reversion of these moneys.

9 EFF — SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR WQI. The bill
10 appropriates moneys from the EFF to the water quality
11 initiative fund subject to the same conditions applicable to
12 moneys appropriated to the fund from the general fund.

13 IOWA RESOURCES ENHANCEMENT AND PROTECTION (REAP) FUND — EFF
14 APPROPRIATION IN LIEU OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION. An amount
15 of moneys is appropriated from the EFF to the REAP fund instead
16 of the \$20 million otherwise required to be appropriated to
17 the fund from the general fund. Notwithstanding the standing
18 allocation from the REAP fund to the open spaces account, DNR
19 may use moneys in the account for state park maintenance and
20 repair.
