**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act making appropriations to the department of cultural  
2 affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa  
3 finance authority, the public employment relations board,  
4 the department of workforce development, and the state board  
5 of regents and certain regents institutions, and providing  
6 for properly related matters.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS.

2 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
3 to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year  
4 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
5 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
6 purposes designated:

7 a. ADMINISTRATION

8 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
9 purposes:

10 ..... \$ 168,637

11 The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate  
12 activities with the tourism office of the economic development  
13 authority to promote attendance at the state historical  
14 building and at the state's historic sites.

15 b. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS

16 For planning and programming for the community cultural  
17 grants program established under section 303.3:

18 ..... \$ 172,090

19 c. HISTORICAL DIVISION

20 For the support of the historical division:

21 ..... \$ 3,142,351

22 d. HISTORIC SITES

23 For the administration and support of historic sites:

24 ..... \$ 426,398

25 e. ARTS DIVISION

26 For the support of the arts division:

27 ..... \$ 1,317,188

28 Of the moneys appropriated in this paragraph, the department  
29 shall allocate \$300,000 for purposes of the film office.

30 f. IOWA GREAT PLACES

31 For the Iowa great places program established under section  
32 303.3C:

33 ..... \$ 150,000

34 g. CULTURAL TRUST GRANTS

35 For grant programs administered by the Iowa arts

1 council including those programs supporting the long-term  
2 financial stability and sustainability of nonprofit cultural  
3 organizations:

4 ..... \$ 150,000

5 h. GREENLIGHT GRANTS

6 For a grant program to support filmmakers and media  
7 production:

8 ..... \$ 450,000

9 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
10 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
11 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
12 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
13 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

14 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

15 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, the goals  
16 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and  
17 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and  
18 increase the population of the state.

19 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic  
20 development authority shall do all of the following for the  
21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022:

22 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that  
23 result in commercially viable products and services.

24 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free  
25 market, private sector philosophies.

26 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the  
27 state.

28 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually  
29 improve the economic development climate along with the  
30 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

31 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they  
32 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

33 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to  
34 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential.

35 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,

1 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.  
2 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through  
3 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks  
4 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small  
5 businesses.

6 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of  
7 life to foster economic growth.

8 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development  
9 through development, expansion, and modernization of  
10 infrastructure.

11 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses  
12 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism  
13 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to  
14 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

15 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative  
16 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

17 Sec. 3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

18 1. APPROPRIATION

19 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
20 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
21 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
22 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
23 purposes designated in this subsection:

24 ..... \$ 13,318,553

25 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,  
26 programs, marketing, and the maintenance of an administration  
27 division, a business development division, a community  
28 development division, a small business development division,  
29 and other divisions the authority may organize.

30 (2) For business development operations and programs,  
31 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,  
32 and the partner state program.

33 (3) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section  
34 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure  
35 projects.

1 (4) For community economic development programs, tourism  
2 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps  
3 and summer youth programs, the main street and rural main  
4 street programs, the school-to-career program, the community  
5 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related  
6 programs.

7 (5) For achieving the goals and accountability, and  
8 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

9 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
10 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
11 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
12 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this  
13 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

14 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

15 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in  
16 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring  
17 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are  
18 citizens of the United States who reside within the United  
19 States, or any person authorized to work in the United States  
20 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens  
21 residing in the United States.

22 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in  
23 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and  
24 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the  
25 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who  
26 reside within the United States, or any person authorized to  
27 work in the United States, pursuant to federal law, including  
28 legal resident aliens residing in the United States.

29 c. A business that receives financial assistance from  
30 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall  
31 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this  
32 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided  
33 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received  
34 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals  
35 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to

1 recapture by the authority.

2 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

3 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
4 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a  
5 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting  
6 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former  
7 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and  
8 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

9 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
10 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage  
11 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

12 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
13 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of  
14 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and  
15 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,  
16 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

17 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in  
18 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance for  
19 the Iowa green streets pilot project or for any other program  
20 or project that involves the installation of geothermal systems  
21 for melting snow and ice from streets or sidewalks.

22 4. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

23 In lieu of the standing appropriation in section 15.368  
24 there is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
25 economic development authority for the fiscal year beginning  
26 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount  
27 for the world food prize:

28 ..... \$ 375,000

29 5. IOWA COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEER SERVICE

30 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
31 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
32 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
33 amount for allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer  
34 service for purposes of the Iowa state commission grant program  
35 and the Iowa's promise and Iowa mentoring partnership programs:

1 ..... \$ 168,201

2 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the  
3 authority shall allocate \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa state  
4 commission grant program and \$93,201 for purposes of the Iowa's  
5 promise and Iowa mentoring partnership programs.

6 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
7 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
8 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
9 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 6. COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENTS — ASSISTANCE

12 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
13 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
14 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
15 amount to be used for the purposes of providing financial  
16 assistance to Iowa's councils of governments:

17 ..... \$ 275,000

18 7. FUTURE READY IOWA REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP DEVELOPMENT  
19 PROGRAM

20 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
21 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
22 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
23 amount to be used for the funding of the future ready Iowa  
24 registered apprenticeship development program under chapter  
25 15C, to encourage small to midsize businesses to start or grow  
26 registered apprenticeships:

27 ..... \$ 760,000

28 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
29 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
30 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
31 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
32 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

33 8. REGIONAL SPORTS AUTHORITY DISTRICTS

34 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
35 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year

1 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
2 amount to be distributed equally to regional sports authority  
3 districts certified by the authority pursuant to section  
4 15E.321:

5 ..... \$ 500,000

6 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
7 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
8 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
9 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 9. SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS  
12 INTERNSHIPS

13 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
14 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the Iowa economic  
15 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
16 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so  
17 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
18 designated:

19 For the funding of internships for students studying in the  
20 fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics  
21 with eligible Iowa employers as provided in section 15.411,  
22 subsection 3, paragraph "c":

23 ..... \$ 1,000,000

24 b. No more than 3 percent of the moneys appropriated in this  
25 subsection may be used by the authority for costs associated  
26 with administration of the internship program.

27 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
28 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
29 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
30 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in  
31 subsequent fiscal years.

32 10. FUTURE READY IOWA — VOLUNTEER MENTORING PROGRAM

33 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
34 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic  
35 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,



1 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so  
2 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
3 designated:

4 For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer services  
5 to be used for establishing a volunteer mentor program to  
6 support implementation of the future ready Iowa skilled  
7 workforce last-dollar scholarship program in section 261.131  
8 and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant program  
9 created in section 261.132:

10 ..... \$ 400,000

11 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
12 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
13 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
14 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
15 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

16 11. STEM BEST AND EMPOWER RURAL IOWA

17 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
18 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic  
19 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
20 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so  
21 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
22 designated:

23 STEM best:

24 ..... \$ 700,000

25 Empower rural Iowa program:

26 ..... \$ 700,000

27 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
28 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
29 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
30 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
31 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

32 c. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter  
33 17A to establish criteria for the distribution of the moneys  
34 appropriated in this subsection.

35 Sec. 4. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — FY

1 2022-2023. Notwithstanding the standing appropriations  
2 in the following designated sections for the fiscal year  
3 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the amounts  
4 appropriated from the general fund of the state pursuant to  
5 those sections for the following purposes shall not exceed the  
6 following amounts:

7 1. For operational support grants and community cultural  
8 grants under section 99F.11, subsection 4, paragraph "d",  
9 subparagraph (1):

10 ..... \$ 448,403

11 2. For the purposes of regional tourism marketing under  
12 section 99F.11, subsection 4, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

13 ..... \$ 900,000

14 Sec. 5. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REPORTING — ECONOMIC

15 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. The economic development authority  
16 shall submit an annual report to the general assembly no later  
17 than November 1, 2022, that details the amount of every direct  
18 loan, forgivable loan, tax credit, tax exemption, tax refund,  
19 grant, or any other financial assistance awarded to a person  
20 during the prior fiscal year by the authority under an economic  
21 development program administered by the authority. The report  
22 shall identify the county where the project associated with  
23 each such award is located.

24 Sec. 6. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the  
25 moneys collected by the insurance division in excess of the  
26 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection  
27 3, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, \$100,000  
28 shall be transferred to the economic development authority for  
29 insurance economic development and international insurance  
30 economic development.

31 Sec. 7. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

32 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
33 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning  
34 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount,  
35 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to provide

1 reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible persons under  
2 the home and community-based services rent subsidy program  
3 established in section 16.55:

4 ..... \$ 658,000

5 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, not more than  
6 \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

7 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
8 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
9 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
10 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
11 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

12 Sec. 8. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state  
13 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority  
14 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

15 Sec. 9. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD.

16 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
17 to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year  
18 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
19 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
20 purposes designated:

21 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
22 purposes:

23 ..... \$ 1,492,452

24 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board  
25 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining an internet site that  
26 allows access to a searchable database of collective bargaining  
27 information.

28 Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There  
29 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
30 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
32 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
33 purposes designated:

34 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

35 a. For the division of labor services, including salaries,

1 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

2 ..... \$ 3,491,252

3 b. From the contractor registration fees, the division of  
4 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections  
5 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under  
6 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

7 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

8 a. For the division of workers' compensation, including  
9 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:  
10 ..... \$ 3,321,044

11 b. The division of workers' compensation shall charge a  
12 \$100 filing fee for workers' compensation cases. The filing  
13 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However,  
14 the fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party,  
15 except in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be  
16 unjust under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the  
17 filing fee allowed under this paragraph are appropriated to the  
18 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of  
19 administering the division of workers' compensation.

20 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

21 a. For the operation of field offices and the workforce  
22 development board:  
23 ..... \$ 6,675,650

24 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a", the  
25 department shall allocate \$150,000 to the state library for the  
26 purpose of licensing an online resource which prepares persons  
27 to succeed in the workplace through programs which improve job  
28 skills and vocational test-taking abilities.

29 4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

30 a. For the development and administration of an offender  
31 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills:  
32 ..... \$ 387,158

33 b. The department of workforce development shall partner  
34 with the department of corrections to provide staff within  
35 the correctional facilities resources to improve offenders'

1 abilities to find and retain productive employment.

2 5. INTEGRATED INFORMATION FOR IOWA SYSTEM

3 For the payment of services provided by the department of  
4 administrative services related to the integrated information  
5 for Iowa system:

6 ..... \$ 228,822

7 6. SUMMER YOUTH INTERN PILOT PROGRAM

8 For the funding of a summer youth intern pilot program that  
9 will help young people at risk of not graduating from high  
10 school to explore and prepare for high-demand careers through  
11 summer work experience, including the development of soft  
12 skills:

13 ..... \$ 250,000

14 7. NONREVERSION

15 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
16 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of  
17 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for  
18 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the  
19 succeeding fiscal year.

20 Sec. 11. GENERAL FUND — EMPLOYEE MISCLASSIFICATION

21 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
22 state to the department of workforce development for the fiscal  
23 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the  
24 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
25 used for the purposes designated:

26 For enhancing efforts to investigate employers that  
27 misclassify workers:

28 ..... \$ 379,631

29 Sec. 12. SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

30 1. There is appropriated from the special employment  
31 security contingency fund to the department of workforce  
32 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and  
33 ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or so much thereof  
34 as is necessary, to be used for field offices:

35 ..... \$ 2,416,084

1 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue  
2 collected by the department of workforce development is  
3 appropriated to the department for the fiscal year beginning  
4 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, to accomplish the  
5 mission of the department.

6 Sec. 13. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND —  
7 FIELD OFFICES. Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 8,  
8 paragraph "e", there is appropriated from interest earned on  
9 the unemployment compensation reserve fund to the department  
10 of workforce development for the fiscal year beginning July  
11 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amount, or  
12 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
13 designated:

14 For the operation of field offices:

15 ..... \$ 2,200,000

16 Sec. 14. VIRTUAL ACCESS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OFFICES. The  
17 department of workforce development shall require a unique  
18 identification login for all users of workforce development  
19 centers operated through electronic means.

20 Sec. 15. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding  
21 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to  
22 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United  
23 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security  
24 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce  
25 development and shall be used by the department for the  
26 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.  
27 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year  
28 beginning after December 31, 2022.

29 Sec. 16. IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION FUND.

30 1. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
31 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the following  
32 departments, agencies, and institutions for the fiscal year  
33 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following  
34 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
35 purposes designated:

1 a. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

2 (1) For the purposes of providing assistance as described in  
3 section 15.335B for the high quality jobs program:

4 ..... \$ 11,700,000

5 From the moneys appropriated in this subparagraph, the  
6 economic development authority may use not more than \$1,000,000  
7 for purposes of providing infrastructure grants to main street  
8 communities under the main street Iowa program and may allocate  
9 not more than \$300,000 for the purposes of supporting statewide  
10 worker education and quality preapprenticeship programs.

11 (2) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in  
12 this lettered paragraph "a", an entity shall testify upon the  
13 request of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic  
14 development regarding the expenditure of such moneys.

15 b. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS AND REGENTS INSTITUTIONS

16 (1) STATE BOARD OF REGENTS. For capacity building  
17 infrastructure in areas related to technology  
18 commercialization, marketing and business development  
19 efforts in areas related to technology commercialization,  
20 entrepreneurship, and business growth, and infrastructure  
21 projects and programs needed to assist in implementation of  
22 activities under chapter 262B:

23 ..... \$ 3,000,000

24 (a) Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to this  
25 subparagraph (1), 35 percent shall be allocated for Iowa state  
26 university of science and technology, 35 percent shall be  
27 allocated for the state university of Iowa, and 30 percent  
28 shall be allocated for the university of northern Iowa.

29 (b) The institutions shall provide a one-to-one match  
30 of additional moneys for the activities funded with moneys  
31 appropriated under this subparagraph (1).

32 (c) The state board of regents shall submit a report by  
33 January 15, 2023, to the governor and the general assembly  
34 regarding the activities, projects, and programs funded with  
35 moneys appropriated under this subparagraph (1). The report

1 shall be provided in an electronic format and shall include a  
2 list of metrics and criteria mutually agreed to in advance by  
3 the board of regents and the economic development authority.  
4 The metrics and criteria shall allow the governor's office and  
5 the general assembly to quantify and evaluate the progress  
6 of the board of regents institutions with regard to their  
7 activities, projects, and programs in the areas of technology  
8 commercialization, entrepreneurship, regional development, and  
9 market research.

10 (2) IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. For  
11 small business development centers, the research park, and the

EXPLANATION

1           The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
2           the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

3           This bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2022-2023  
4 from the general fund of the state to the department of  
5 cultural affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa  
6 finance authority, the public employment relations board, the  
7 department of workforce development, Iowa state university of  
8 science and technology, the state university of Iowa, and the  
9 university of northern Iowa.

10          The bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2022-2023  
11 from the Iowa skilled worker and job creation fund created in  
12 Code section 8.75 to the economic development authority, the  
13 department of workforce development, and the state board of  
14 regents and institutions under the control of the board.

15          For the fiscal year 2022-2023, the bill limits standing  
16 appropriations established in the Code for the world food  
17 prize, certain operational support grants, community cultural  
18 grants, and regional tourism marketing.

19          The bill transfers \$100,000 of the moneys collected by the  
20 insurance division in excess of the anticipated gross revenues  
21 under Code section 505.7 to the economic development authority.

22          The bill appropriates moneys for the fiscal year 2022-2023  
23 from the special employment security contingency fund to the  
24 department of workforce development.

25          The bill appropriates interest earned on the unemployment  
26 compensation reserve fund for the fiscal year 2022-2023 to the
